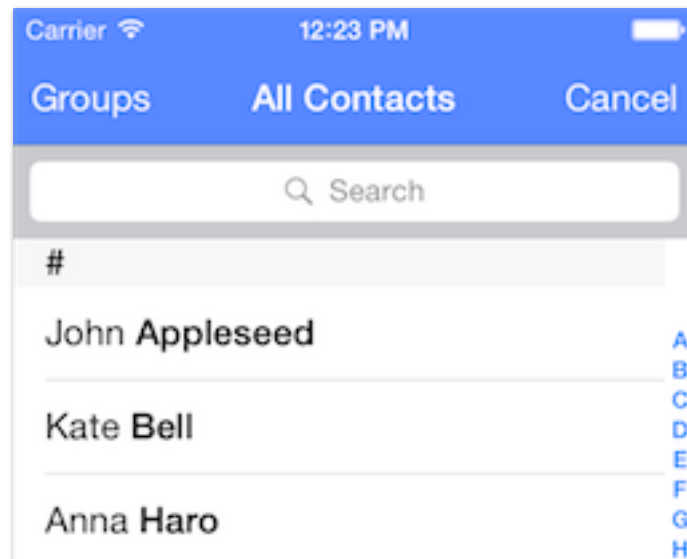
About AIF

Addressbook Image Fetcher is a great tool for retrieving photos back from profiles in Contacts on iOS devices.

Finding contact



Use the search button to get your contacts. Here you can choose which of your contacts to retrieve profile image (Shown on image below).



No Contact Image

If your chosen contact does not contain any images, it will return a view of «No Contact Image» (Shown in image below).



Remove Image

Clear Image

Use the clear image to remove any fetched images from the view. This does not delete any images, neither in contacts, nor in Photos, it merely removes images from the view.

Save Image

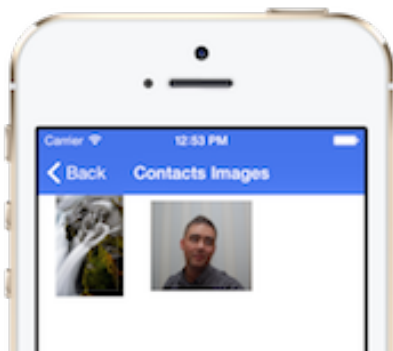


When you have chosen a contact, and retrieved an image, you can use the save button to store the image in Photos.

iOS change

Support for the newest iOS version.

Linked Contacts



This was a feature that was chosen automatically for the user when contacts had multiple images connected to their profile. Linked contacts are no longer supported in the newest iOS versions of Addressbook Image Fetcher.

Q & A

Q: iPhone Won't Allow AIF Access Photos.

A: Go to Settings -> Privacy -> Photos. Enable Addressbook Imagefetcher

Q: AIF Not Shown In Settings -> Privacy-> Photos.

A: In newer iOS versions you might look in Settings, scroll past twitter and facebook settings. Look for AIF / Addressbook Imagefetcher.
